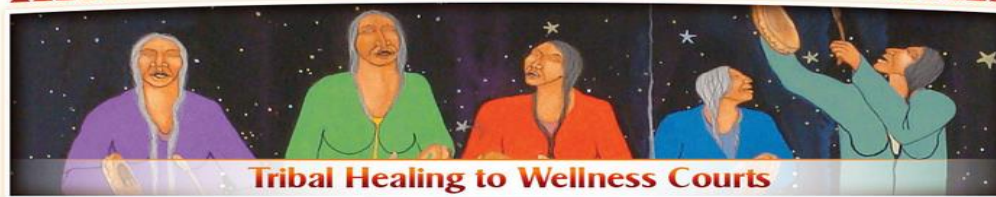

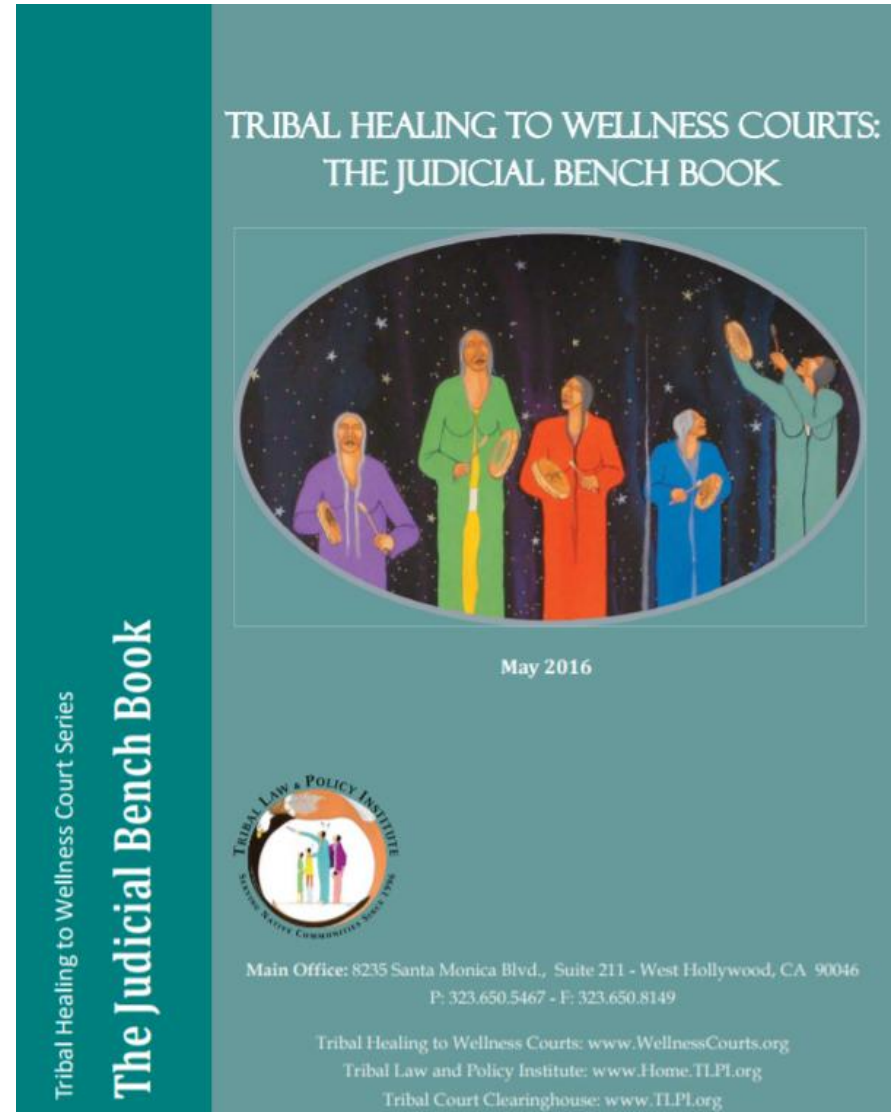
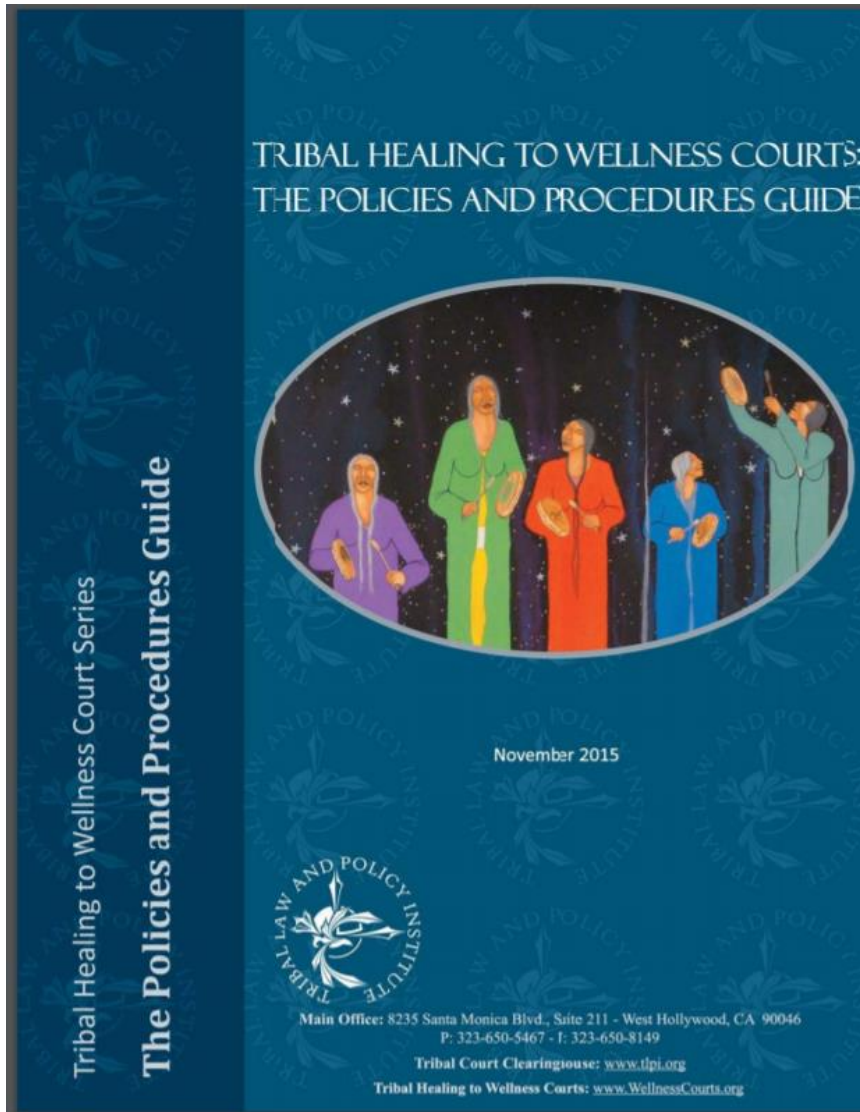

## Federal Funding Agencies

There are three major federal funding agencies for Tribal Healing to Wellness Courts:

1. Bureau of Justice Assistance
2. Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention
3. Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)

In addition, the U.S. Department of Justice operates the Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitation (CTAS), combines most of the tribal-specific grants into one solicitation. CTAS includes at least two opportunities for Healing to Wellness Court funding.

### Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitation (CTAS)

On November 30, 2016, the Department of Justice announced the opening of the grant solicitation period for comprehensive funding to support public safety, victim services, and crime prevention improvements in American Indian and Alaska Native communities. The Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitation (CTAS) is administered by the Justice Department's Office of Justice Program (OJP), Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS), and Office on Violence Against Women (OVW). The funding can be used to enhance law enforcement; bolster adult and juvenile justice systems; prevent and control juvenile delinquency; serve sexual assault, domestic violence, and elder victims; and support other efforts to combat crime.

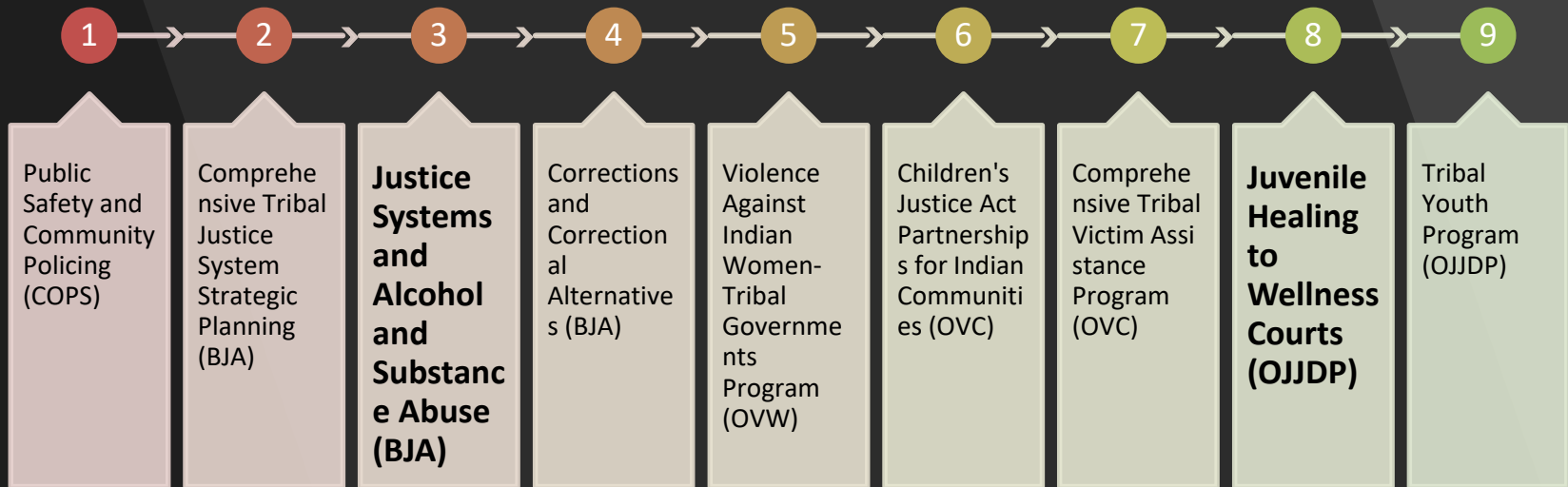

# CTAS: Purpose Areas #3 and #8



# BJA Non-Tribal

- *Adult Drug Court Discretionary Grant*
  - Implementation: \$400,000/36 months
  - Enhancement: \$400,000/36 months
- *Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (CARA)*
  - Overdose Outreach Projects
  - **System-Level Diversion and Alternatives to Incarceration Projects**
  - Data-Driven Responses to Prescription Drug Misuse

# OJJDP

- ***Family Drug Court***
  - Implementation - \$600,000/36 months
  - Enhancement - \$400,000/36 months
- ***Juvenile Drug Treatment Court***
  - \$500,000/36 months

# SAMHSA

- ***Adult Treatment Drug Courts and Adult Tribal Healing to Wellness Courts***
  - \$325,000 per year for up to 3 years
- ***Family Treatment Drug Courts***
  - \$425,000 per year for up to 5 years
